


SHIRLEY PARISH BOOK CLUB


The Lamplighters by Emma Stonex

'.... a whodunnit, horror novel, ghost story and gripping psychological investigation all rolled into one.' (The Guardian review, 2021)

This book created a difference of opinion within the Book Club, whilst some of us loved it and the characters and the descriptions of the sea and life in a lighthouse, others didn't take to it at all, either the characters or the narrative. Some of us liked the way the relationships between the women partners of the lighthouse keepers evolved.

It certainly made us all think about life on a lighthouse in the past prior to any automation, and how isolating this would be.





Tension seems to feature heavily in this novel, between the characters in the story and between the story and the reader. The three men who disappear from the lighthouse have lived lives dominated by unspoken tension between each other and with the sea. For more than twenty years after they have disappeared, an unspoken tension continues between the wives they have left behind. Just as the sea has mysterious depths so too do the lives of all the people in the novel. The lighthouse, the sea and the people are opaque.

The next book is The Book of Beginnings by Sally Page.



THE POD PROJECT

Sometimes things just don't go as we plan. A couple of months back we discovered that the original plans drawn up for the Pod in St James Church contained an error, and the design was not compatible with disability regulations for access to the toilet. The builders' preparations were put on hold as there had to be a new design which did meet all the regulations.

When we saw the new design, which involved dismantling the old internal lobby in the South Transept and building a new one from which there would be access to the toilet, we were both pleased and dismayed. Pleased because it was a design much improved on the original which would look neater and function better; dismayed because it meant we had to seek new permission from the Diocese which could delay the whole project for many months. The builders needed a decision almost immediately to keep to their proposed start date of 6th January.

Kate Crocker got to work and made contact with the Diocesan authorities, stressing the importance of a speedy decision. We received the necessary permission just before Christmas but unfortunately this wasn't soon enough for the builders to hold our slot and we are now waiting for a new start date which we hope will be in February. The revised plans can be seen at the back of St James Church (an outline sketch is also below). Hopefully we will see the fruits of all this soon!

CANDLEMAS - SUNDAY 2nd FEBRUARY

In bygone centuries, Christians said their last farewells to the Christmas season on Candlemas, 2nd February. This is exactly 40 days after Christmas Day itself.

In New Testament times 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'public appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child - to 'present Him to the Lord'. At the same time, she, as a new mother, was 'purified'. Thus, we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple.

So, where does the Candlemas bit come in? Jesus is described in the New Testament as the Light of the World, and early Christians developed the tradition of lighting many candles in celebration of this day. The Church also fell into the custom of blessing the year's supply of candles for the church on this day - hence the name, Candlemas.

The story of how Candlemas began can be found in Luke 2:22-40. Simeon's great declaration of faith and recognition of who Jesus was is of course found in the Nunc Dimittis, which is embedded in the Office of Evening Prayer in the West. But in medieval times, the Nunc Dimittis was mostly used just on this day, during the distribution of candles before the Eucharist. Only gradually did it win a place in the daily prayer life of the Church.

LOVE IN ACTION!

'Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.' (1 John 3:18).

The writer Gary Chapman describes how love can be expressed in 5 different 'languages': words of encouragement, quality time, gifts, acts of service and touch. Do you have a preferred language of love? As we think about St Valentine during this month, let's consider how God's love language is expressed in the word *agape*. This is exclusively found in the New Testament and is uniquely defined by Jesus: '*This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down His life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters.*' (1 John 3:16). Jesus' giving of His life on the cross provides the model for how we can demonstrate God's love in our relationships with others.

It is self-giving: are we ready to put the other person first, as Jesus did when He died for us in our place. Are we generous with our time, words, money and service, whatever the cost?

It takes the initiative: are we ready to show love to those who don't deserve it or who we find hard to love? Do we have eyes of compassion to see their needs and a heart to love and serve them?

It is intentional: are we ready to get close to those in need around us, irrespective of the time we have or how we feel?

The story is told of Jesus asking a little child, 'how much do you love me?' The child replied 'lots and lots and lots!' Then they asked Jesus how much He loved them. Jesus stretched out His arms wide and said 'I love you this much', as they nailed Him to a cross.



ST VALENTINE'S DAY - FRIDAY 14th FEBRUARY

Saint Valentine's Day, many believe, was named after one or more Christian martyrs and was established by Pope Gelasius 1 in 496 AD. Valentine of Rome was martyred about 269, and this day usually 'belongs' to him.

The first recorded association of Valentine Day with romantic love (1382) is from Geoffrey Chaucer. He wrote, 'For this was Saint Valentine's Day, when every bird cometh there to choose his mate.' This poem was in honour of the first anniversary of the engagement of King Richard II of England to Anne of Bohemia. Valentine Day is referred to by Ophelia in Hamlet (1600-1601).

To-morrow is St Valentine's day All in the morning betime And I a maid at your window To be your Valentine.

The modern mention of Valentine's Day can be found in a collection of English nursery rhymes (1784):

The rose is red, the violet's blue The honey's sweet, and so are you. Thou are my love and I am thine I drew thee to my Valentine.

NATIONAL NEST BOX WEEK 14th - 21st FEBRUARY

Did you take part in the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch in January?

Where can family-minded birds raise their young these days? As our gardens and parklands become smaller and tidier, too many natural nest sites – such as holes in trees, old buildings and unkempt hedgerows – are rapidly disappearing

No wonder that our sparrows, greenfinches and swifts are in precipitous decline, and that one in four of our UK bird species are now under serious threat.

This makes it more important than ever to care for our remaining birds. By feeding, providing water and putting up nest boxes we can give them a safe space to raise their chicks.



The National Nest Box Week initiative encourages bird conservation across the UK, and it's easy to get involved, whether you're a teacher, part of a local wildlife group, or just wanting to boost the bird numbers in your own garden.


Living Hope offers us the opportunity to deepen our hope in God and be part of what God is doing to bring hope in the world.




