# **Climate Sunday: Shirley Parish**

In September 2020, the Churches Together in Britain and Ireland, together with support from a number of charities, asked churches across the nations to hold Climate Sunday events before 5<sup>th</sup> September 2021.

These will focus on

Worship- a service focused on creation and the present threat to the planet

**Commitment**- as a parish and as individuals to do what we can to help

**Speaking up**- petitioning the government to intensify its efforts to combat global warming

The feedback from the grassroots will be included in a National Climate Sunday event on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and used to lobby in the weeks leading up to the vital COP26 conference in Glasgow in November.

Sunday 27th June 10.30 am in St James's Church

It is difficult to give more detail at this point, although we are busy planning, because everything depends on the road map. Please save the date and keep this vital work in your prayers



# Wanted: Citizen Scientists! Churchyard nature count 5<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> June.

It has been estimated that the area of churchyard land in England and Wales is equivalent to an extra national park! Because the land has not been ploughed or developed, it has the potential to support a diverse community of wildlife.

The churches, in partnership with charities A Rocha and Caring for God's Acre and the National Biodiversity Network are suggesting that parishes invite people to visit churchyards between 5<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> June and record what they see.

This project can be week- long or just a single session and records made on paper or digitally. There are lots of resources to help identification and people can choose what they want to observe- birds, insects, grasses, flowers, mosses lichens.

We have registered our interest in the idea but what we do depends entirely on finding 'citizen scientists' interested in exploring what we have in the churchyard in June. As a minimum, it would be good to discover the range of wild flowers, have a birdwatching session and perhaps identify and make a photographic record of as many different lichens as possible.
