Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

- a time to be born, and a time to die;
- a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;
- a time to kill, and a time to heal;
- a time to break down, and a time to build up;
- a time to weep, and a time to laugh;
- a time to mourn, and a time to dance;
- a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together;
- a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;
- a time to seek, and a time to lose;

a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.

Luke 8:1-3

Soon afterwards he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. The twelve were with him, as well as some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, and Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, and Susanna, and many others, who provided for them out of their resources.

Sermon (Gill Gough)

I wonder what you pray for when you pray for healing. A cure for some physical ailment, a forgiveness, a reconciliation, relief or ease, strength, a restoration, peace for a troubled heart, wholeness of body mind and spirit. Each of us will most likely have different interpretations of the word and certainly different prayer expectations which may change over time as circumstances in our lives change.

Healing and all its connotations is an integral part of the good news of Jesus Christ. The Bible is full of instances where people have been healed individually and instances where whole nations have been restored.

It is apparent in Scripture that the physical, emotional, social and spiritual well-being of humankind is closely interconnected. Christ's work of reconciliation extends beyond the purely personal and relational needs to the social order of the whole of creation. (Read Colossians 1 v 15-27) Injustice and reconciliation, harmony and healing are all inter locked in God's great plan for mankind. The gospels use the term 'healing' both for physical healing and for the broader salvation that Jesus promises.

A common New Testament word for sickness is weakness, which carries broad associations of powerlessness and vulnerability. As Christians face weakness of whatever kind, they receive God's grace, expressed sometimes in an experience of healing and sometimes through the strength that comes in the bearing of sickness or suffering.

Most individuals, at any given time, know at least a handful of people who are battling an illness of some kind. One of those people may even be themselves. Now that there is a powerful global pandemic, we are facing greater fear over the mere possibility of sickness as well as the realistic impact this could have on those with pre-existing medical conditions. No matter what the specific circumstances may be, the plea, the prayer and the hope is for healing, for self and for others, for the nation and for the world.

Whether the ailment is physical, mental, spiritual or emotional, praying for healing as well as strength to cope, is a productive, common response and there are many inspirational verses to be found in the bible to verify this.

One of the stories concerns Mary Magdalene whose feast day occurs tomorrow, 22nd July.

She is a prime example of one who receives Christ's healing touch. Did she ask for healing, or understanding for herself and other people of something beyond her control, or a freeing of her emotions.

The scripture says "Mary (called Magdalene) from whom seven demons had gone out".

Can you imagine having seven demons inside you? Mary was definitely tortured by this for quite a time. In Mark's gospel after the crucifixion, it states that the risen Jesus first appeared to Mary Magdalene from whom he had cast out seven demons. There is no doubt about who had performed the miracle of healing her. It was Jesus himself, her Lord and Saviour.

What a change that made to her life: from demoniac bondage to the freedom of Jesus Christ. Mary became a follower of Jesus, travelling with other women and the disciples and she ministered to them, and became known as the Apostle to the Apostles.

Jesus healed Mary Magdalene and she was faithful to him, right unto the end and even after his crucifixion.

I wonder how has Jesus answered your prayers, has he shown you his healing powers? Are you faithful to him now and hopefully for ever?

Will you keep praying and trusting in him, and witness to his healing power, his love and his compassion?

And what about prayers that seem unanswered or answered in a different way to what we expected.

What are our thoughts when this happens? Have we a strong enough faith to persist in prayer; to persevere when things seem to get worse instead of

better. As Christians, we know that God loves us. We know that he will help us, and Jesus promised to be with us always; but Jesus came not just to heal, certainly he told us that we would probably suffer, for him. Being a Christian is not a simple option; we haven't chosen the easy life free from all troubles. Our reward will be found in heaven, when we meet Jesus and God face to face, and as I believe we will be reunited with loved ones who have gone before us. Whatever our prayer may be I firmly believe that God has a plan and a purpose which we mere mortals may neither understand nor comprehend.

Whatever you are currently up against, I pray you will receive relief and comfort that will alleviate some of the tension and worry that comes from facing difficult situations and distressing and painful circumstances, especially during taxing seasons of life when there seems to be more questions than answers.

I pray that your prayers will be answered as you wish, whether for yourself, someone you love or someone you have never met. But keep trusting in God and his Son Jesus Christ and you will receive that inner strength and peace that only our Lord and Saviour can provide.

I leave you with a verse from Isaiah ch 41 v 10
Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God.
I will strengthen you, Yes I will help you.
I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

What more could one want. Amen
