

ECO CHURCH & GOD'S TWO ACRES IN SHIRLEY

We have qualified for a bronze award from Eco church, on the basis of our current activities and have set up a Focus Group to see how we can build on this and eventually go for gold! As far as I can see, we are the first Eco Church in Shirley. Unfortunately, the system does not seem to recognise a Parish with three congregations, so we are listed by the Google location of St James's.

We will be keeping everyone informed of ideas and proposed actions and our Lent courses will focus on creation and our place in it.

The weather has been mild (so far) and the churchyard is full of snowdrops, crocuses and primroses with daffodils and bluebells not far behind.

St James's Management Committee has agreed that we can manage part of the area between the north side of the church and the grass path for wildlife. This means allowing grass and wildflowers to grow unchecked until August, when the area will be strimmed and raked. A further cut and rake will be needed in October. We will enclose the area with a rope boundary, avoiding the few graves which are still visited and making a neat, mown border in front of the boundary posts. We will also display notices to explain the experiment.

I am hoping to develop an area to encourage wildlife with a bird feeder, insect hotel, insect woodpile and jute bags of leaf to compost. This will probably be in a rectangular strip adjacent to the wall opposite Church House, although there is not much space. I will keep everyone posted.



The formal church garden is developing well, and I have planted three new rose bushes - a wedding gift from the Choir, including Rosa 'Friends Forever', which is what happens when you join a choir! Peter Sellars has recently planted daffodils and I am removing the emerging bluebells to the churchyard where they can spread unchecked.

This is fun and very creative! All ideas and help are welcome. Watch this space.

MONUMENTAL HEADACHE!

Linda Pitt and I have just completed a safety check of gravestones in St James's churchyard and a number are in need of repair.

Graves remain the property of the family who set them up but in a 200 year old churchyard, many are no longer visited. The old, Victorian, single buried headstone seems to survive quite well but memorials held together with cement, pegs or metal rods can gradually become loose as the ground settles. If a memorial poses a danger, the deputy wardens are required it make it safe then try to contact family to advise repair.

Memorials in need of repair have now been marked either with hazard tape or a small note, left by the graves which seem still to be tended. A full list of all the memorials in need of repair (or just observation) is available in the Parish Office. After due notice, so that families can engage with this, we will need to apply for a Faculty to carry out any works.

Away from the paths, the ground in the churchyard is very uneven because graves always subside with time. We try to fill the worst dips, but great care is needed when walking in the area.

ADAVU, FOOD BANK & CLOTHING BANK NEWS

ADAVU: Liisa and her colleagues at ADAVU (the charity supporting folks rescued in the West Midlands from trafficking and modern day slavery) which this parish helps mainly through the Christmas Gift Tree and some emergency supplies, received a wonderful letter from a client recently which concluded with "my gratitude for all the support you gave me, walking me through a difficult time. I must say you inspire me, and I thank God for you and the passion He has given you to help others". This helped to assuage the trauma to the team caused when several men with knives tried to persuade their victims to return to them — big money is involved in trafficking and slavery and the successful escape of each victim might encourage others to make a dash for freedom!

NARTHEX: the Resource Centre has yet to appoint a new Coordinator – to all intents and purposes it remains closed.

CLOTHING BANK: currently the only shortages are warm sweaters and jackets for men, and men's shoes sizes 8 and 9. Jacki C who is the specific Nurse at Heartlands and Solihull Hospital dealing with the homeless has asked me if I could find her some clothing suitable for men patients – **pyjamas, dressing gowns, slippers** etc. – has anyone anything suitable tucked away in a drawer somewhere?

FOOD BANK: it took eight weeks to clear the huge backlog of food which came in at Christmas. We were very grateful to teams from local and national organisations and schools, including some super children from Hazel Oak School in Shirley, who tackled the huge job of sorting and dating the donations. Oh, that organisations would spread their generosity throughout the year instead of swamping us in the week before Christmas! Inevitably some of the food had suffered from being under (literally) tons of tins for that length of time. Sadly, we had to dump squashed cakes, fresh flowers (!), fresh fruit etc.

The appeal this month is yet again for **small bags of sugar, crispbreads, dried milk and cooking oil**. The situation for the Toiletry Bags is dire - although I have plenty of soaps and toothbrushes, I have no **shaving foam or razors** for the men's bags - 60% of the clients at "our" Food Bank are single men, usually in hostels, sleeping rough or sofa surfing which means that our emphasis needs to be on toiletries for men.

With the Easter holidays coming up it would be good to be able to repeat the very successful **colouring books and washable felt tip pens/coloured pencils** which we bagged up for the Little Ones in the Christmas holidays.

ADAVU, FOOD BANK & CLOTHING BANK NEWS continued

Smaller packs of felt tips are better than the larger ones (shades of small bags of sugar versus the larger ones!) because children like the brighter colours and the large packs have an unpopular majority of dark greys, greens and blacks. When a family is living in one room/hostel accommodation with no money and no garden it's a superb way of occupying Little Ones for short periods.

THE PERSECUTED CHURCH

[Andrey knew that his wife] "would be waiting in line at the new milk store that had opened in a decommissioned church on the other side of the neighbourhood. She said the milk there was fresher and the line was shorter, but Andrey knew this wasn't true. Like so many, she went there because the small chapel at the back of the church had a mosaic of 'Christ and the Woman at the Well' that no-one had bothered to dismantle; and the women who waited in line for their milk were willing to hold your place while you slipped away to pray".

REFLECTED FAITH: THE ALTAR

The long list of television programmes concerned with renovating, moving home, and celebrity homes shows how interested we are in other people's homes, and how they live. The style and furnishings of the buildings vary considerably, and you can find out a great deal about the person by looking at what they have on display or indeed the lack of items.

In my house the only books on show are related to walking and gardening, and the wall pictures are either old and family heirlooms or show the natural world. Yet in every house there are some things that are pretty much a given: they're always there in one form or another.

It's the same in churches. No matter how old the building is, or how many times it has been re-ordered, there are some items which are constant.

One of these essential items is the 'Altar' or 'Table'. In the majority of churches this is the place of most 'holiness' and where 'reverence' is given. The place where 'Bread is broken, and wine outpoured' in remembrance of Christ's last meal with His disciples.

CARE FOR GOD'S CREATION SHIRLEY PARISH LENT GROUPS 2020

The groups will be based on the Church of England's #LiveLent campaign for 2020 called **Care for God's Creation**. This gives a daily reading, reflection and a suggestion for practical action for each day in Lent and is focused on our care for the environment. This fits in very well with the Parish initiative to become an Eco Church.

#LiveLent takes us through the six days of creation looking at one aspect each week. The sixth day will be covered in our reflective worship on 8th April in Holy Week.

Day 1 / week 1 – Light
Day 2 / week 2– Water
Day 3 / week 3 – Land and plants
Day 4 / week 4 – Stars and seasons
Day 5 / week 5 – Creatures of sea and sky
Day 6 / week 6 – Animals and humans

You don't have to use the daily reflections – though these are highly recommended and will help you get the most out of the groups.

The Lent groups will meet on:

Wednesday afternoons

2.30pm - 4pm at Church House from 4th March to 1st April (5 weeks)

Thursday evenings

7.30pm - 9pm at 18 Widney Lane from 5th March to 2nd April (5 weeks)

On Wednesday evening in Holy Week (8th April) the Reflective Worship at St John's Church at 7.30pm will effectively bring the course to a close.

The Care for God's Creation booklets are available from all three churches and we ask for a donation of £1.50 to cover the cost of the booklet.



LOOK FOR GOOD PASTURE – SPEND TIME WITH GOOD PEOPLE

There are some people who inspire you to be all you can as a Christian. When you meet one of these, it is a good idea to stay near them, and learn all you can from them. We are affected by the people whom we spend time with – pray that you will meet people who will lift you up, and not drag you down, in your Christian walk. The Bible says: 'He who walks with wise men will be wise.' (Proverbs 13:20)

Many Christians admit that their present Christian faith was built on the wonderful example of Christians they met during their teenage years. They were inspired and encouraged and moulded by these older Christians. What a wonderful gift they were given! Good spiritual nourishment is vital for building a strong, vibrant faith.

Seeing God bless someone else can increase your own desire to reach higher, and also be blessed in that way. When you see a 'successful' Christian, don't be envious, and want to sabotage them. Instead, be inspired and ask God to use *you* in some fruitful way. But remember – Jesus said that HE is the vine, and we are only the branches. No branch is ever going to flourish unless it stays deeply attached to the vine.

EAT SEASONALLY

Eco-warriors who lead protest marches may have good intent, but what are they doing at home? Are they block-paving their gardens or eating avocados, for example?

Alan Titchmarsh, writing in his recent column in *Gardeners' World*, points out: "We cannot berate members of the Royal family and global superstars for flying hither and yon in private jets if we buy strawberries in January, for they, too, will have necessitated the burning of fossil fuel to reach our table."

Titchmarsh says that if we really want to make a difference, we should eat seasonally. "I yearn for a return to English apples and pears in autumn and winter, strawberries and raspberries in summer, and asparagus from April to June.

And while he would not deprive anyone of "a slice of lemon for their G&T," he does worry "about the growing consumption of avocados, which is causing the destruction of Mexican rainforests to make way for avocado plantations."

So instead of avocados this month, why not consider some artichoke, beetroot, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage (both Savoy and white), carrots, chicory, cauliflowers, endives, fennel, or spinach, to name but a few of the vegetables in season in March?


BOOK REVIEW - 'GOOD GRIEF' BY MALCOLM DUNCAN
